

•• AIRPORT SECURITY COORDINATOR Course Syllabus ••

Description:

This class focuses on aviation security and the many roles of the Airport Security Coordinator as required by 49CFR 1542.3. It includes an overview of the history of aviation security, working functions of the agencies with security responsibilities, an understanding of why information is restricted, information on the purpose of the Airport Security Program, and specific instruction in the functions of the ASC position. Emphasis is placed on the CFR Title 1542, 1544, 1546, 1548 and 1550 Regulations that determine security directives among the airport and airport partners.

Learning Objective:

Upon completion of this course students will be familiar with the Airport Security Plan (ASP) as well as the regulations that govern airport security. The course is designed to prepare individuals to perform the functions of the Airport Security Coordinator as required by 49CFR 1542.3. Upon completion students should know and understand:

- The working functions of the agencies with security responsibility
- The purpose of the Airport Security Plan/Program
- Requirements of the Airport Security Coordinator
- The liaison role with airport law enforcement
- Audit compliance with airport security programs
- Developing corrective action for changed conditions in airport security

Instructional Method:

This course is conducted in a facilitated classroom setting (ILT); or if via self-paced, online, CBT with a required debriefing. The course is designed around the defined learning objectives listed above. Students are taught using a mixture of lecture, interactive discussion, and scenario resolution concerning current topics within aviation, quizzes, and final assessment. Upon successful completion of all course sections, students will receive a Certificate of Completion that can be added to the ASP and employee file. Students should also undergo on-the-job practical review when they return to their work locations.
