AIRPORT LAW ENFORCEMENT / PRIVATE SECURITY OFFICERS SECURITY

Course Description:

This class focuses on aviation security and the many roles the Airport Law Enforcement/Private Security Officers have as required by 49CFR 1542.217 & 1542.219. It includes the aviation particular information for the agencies with security responsibilities at airports, security procedures and activities required by the Airport Security Program (ASP), and specific instruction in the functions of public safety personnel. Emphasis is placed on the Federal, State and Local regulations as well as airport industry best practices and procedures that determine security directive implementation at airports.

Learning Objective:

Upon completion of this course, students will be familiar with the Airport Security Plan (ASP) as well as the regulations that govern airport security. The course is designed to prepare personnel to perform the security functions as required by 49CFR 1542.217 & 219. Upon completion, students should know and understand:

- The key responsibilities of LEOs required by §1542.217
- The key responsibilities of Private Security officers required by §1542.219
- The working functions of the various agencies with security responsibility
- The role of public safety personnel in the airport's ASP
- The liaison role of airport law enforcement with other agencies
- Reporting actions of changed conditions in airport security
- The Airport Emergency Plan (AEP) and contingency plan responsibilities

Recognition will be demonstrated by the ability to pass the final knowledge checks.

Instructional Method:

This course is conducted in a facilitated classroom setting (ILT); or if it is delivered via self-paced, online, CBT students have a required debriefing. The course is designed around the defined learning objectives listed above. Students are taught using a mixture of lecture, interactive discussion, and scenario resolution concerning current topics within aviation, quizzes, and final assessment. A glossary of common terms and acronyms is provided within the course. Knowledge is periodically assessed through interactive quizzes. Upon completion of this course, students must successfully pass a final exam. Students who successfully pass the course will receive a Certificate of Completion. Students should also undergo on-the-job practical review when they return to their work locations.
